VNA's Advanced Illness Management Program (AIM) focuses on better quality of life for those with serious, chronic illnesses through pay and symptom management.

- AIM is a program that focuses on patients with difficulty leaving home due to serious chronic illness
- AIM helps prevent and relieve physical, emotional, social, or spiritual suffering in order to enhance the quality of life
- The goal of AIM is to ease some of the burden of serious illness by giving outstanding care to patients and families through control of symptoms in the home where "home" is defined as where a person lives
- AIM prepares patients and caregivers for transitions related to severe chronic illness whether the outcome is a return to fully independent living or preparation for transition to end-of-life care
- VNA's AIM consultation team works together with a patient's Primary Care Provider (PCP). The PCP remains at the center in directing the medical care and will be kept informed of a patient's ongoing condition
